Internship Descriptions

Internships are based at Neighborhood House School and Youth Programming Sites throughout SW and North Portland (see application and map for specifics). **All of our program sites serve youth from low-income and diverse backgrounds. The team of Equity in Education Interns are invaluable in leading activities that enrich the lives of students and improve their likelihood of success in school and life.** Internships require a 10-week commitment, starting the week of January 4th, and 5-6 hours per week on-site.

Academic Support (all sites): Work one-on-one with students and lead small group lessons focusing on classroom and homework topics. Assists students with homework challenges. Foster connections with students and help them to grow their academic skills and build confidence.

Gardening (Robert Gray MS): Organize garden activities, create curriculum and lesson plans, and lead lessons in the school garden.

Ceramics (Robert Gray MS): Host students in the ceramics studio. Maintain a safe, clean and organized space for students to enjoy working with ceramics. Lead lessons in various ceramics projects.

Maker Space (Robert Gray MS): Develop projects for students that entice them to explore and challenge their creative faculties via tools in the Maker Space. Help the Space coordinator maintaining a safe and inviting place for kids to utilize the special tools available.

Program/Administrative Support (George MS): Assist in communications, data entry, event organizing, and other behind-the-scenes tasks for afterschool programs.

Art Education (all sites): Create art lesson plans and develop curriculum that is engaging and appropriate for different age groups. Lead lessons in painting, drawing, etc.

Sports and Recreation (all sites): Organize and lead activities, create lesson plans for activities that foster inclusivity and enjoyment for sports and recreation. Soccer, volleyball and basketball are winter favorites.
